# **Choosing A Great Electric Razor For Your Needs**

There's a wide variety of electric shavers available on the market today. Whether or not you are searching for your first shaver, or to replace an old one, here are some things to think about as you search for the perfect shaver for you or a loved one. First decide on how much you want to spend. You can find electric shavers varying in price from around \$60.00 to \$200.00.

Have you got a brand preference? The top brands are Braun, Panasonic, Wahl, Remington, Norelco and Shavertronics. Search for deals on the makers web sites, and check with Amazon.com or other shopping sites.

Do you need a portable shaver? If you travel rather a lot, then likely yes. Though many current models are portable or semi-portable, with batteries that last for up to 50 shaves. Additionally, plenty of the chargers accept a wide variety of line voltages, permitting you to bring the charger with you. Cleaning methods vary. Some shavers can be rinsed in running water, some have their own cleaning systems with special fluids that also lubricate the unit, for less wear and longer life.

Do you need a case for travel?

Comparing Electrical Shavers Here are the significant things of importance when comparison shopping :

one ) Rotary head or foil head? Foil shavers are supposed to give the nearest shave, but the longer neck hairs are tough to get with this kind of shaver. To get a really close shave, you often have to apply a little pressure to the skin. Some foil head shaver manufacturers have partnered with safety razor makers ( Braun and Gillette for one ) to design advanced cutting systems that are very good improvements over older designs. Check it out! Rotary shavers are more easy to use on contour surfaces e. G the chin. They use three blades covered by foils. These foil / blade combos are spring loaded, to follow the profile of the face. The revolving blades cut the facial hairs as they enter the foil openings.

two ) How long is the testing period from the maker? If you are changing from a razor, it can take two to four weeks to actually figure out if the electric shaver is for you.

3 ) How long does it take to charge the unit? Can you get a fast re-charge, or use it while it's plugged in? How long will it hold it's charge? Are there signals for how much charge is left on the battery?

four ) Some electric shavers have trimmers for beards, mustaches and sideburns. Some do not.
