The Best Pocket Size Cameras Reviews - Features You Need

While we're reluctant to discuss the Nikon Coolpix S3000, we will take a look at this camera out of fairness and because they have made improvements. Nikon has earned a show of respect, after all, because they've been around for awhile. Because this ultra-compact camera is inexpensive, it is good for those with a matching budget. Unfortunately, the S3000 isn't much better than average. It comes with all the standard features like 12 megapixels, etc. But its LCD screen is a disappointment as it can be quite difficult to see in the sunlight. Being mostly made of plastic gives this camera a cheap look. The image quality is also average meaning the picture quality isn't any better. This camera is for a specific budget and is designed to simply get the job done, nothing more.

The next camera we'll be looking at is the Panasonic Lumix DMC-ZS5. While it has slightly lowered ISOs, this pocket size mega-zoom camera produces good pictures. This camera is a decent alternative to other cameras on the market due to its decent complement of features. You will get good image sharpness and quality pictures with this 12.1 megapixel camera that has an ultra-wide lens. You also have the ability to exert manual control with this camera. Along with a 25 mm wide angle lens, this camera gets its ultra-zoom due to the 12X optical zoom capacity. Because mega-zooms don't have a viewfinder, you simply use the 2.7 inch TFT display.
